He was the last ditch effort to try and calm someone down. He was usually successful.

John also had a great amount of empathy for people. He would talk to people and really be sympathetic to their situation. As police officers, we talk to dozens of people a day. But most people only have a few contacts with the police in their life, and usually under bad situations. John's caring attitude made a difference to these people. To young officers, John sat a good example of the "right" way to talk to people.


Besides dealing with the public, John was always there for his fellow officers when they needed advice. John was a trusting and wise person you could go to.
